

Planned PD Models Defined

Regional workshops

- Aligned with a September to August academic school year
- Variety of venues in major cities throughout the region
- International networking opportunities within a face-to-face learning environment
- Majority of the academic workshop titles on offer including new subjects annually

Online workshops

- Flexible and scalable learning model with the opportunity of reflection on practice
- Planned annually aligned with a January to December calendar year
- Global intercultural networking opportunities within a online interactive learning environment
- Majority of the academic workshop titles on offer including new subjects annually

Blended workshops

- Piloted in the Fall of 2013, extended planned pilot offer 2014
- Combination of online interactive learning and a face-to-face learning environment
- Variety of locations connected to regional event activities
- Great opportunity for networking and reflective learning on selective workshop titles





Requested PD Models Defined

In-school workshops

- Requested by individual schools
- Accommodates training a large numbers of teachers in-house
- Workshop takes place within schools venues only
- Select workshop titles available on request

Cluster workshops

- Piloted in 2013, open as a regular PD model in 2014
- Accommodates training a large numbers of teachers in-house with partnering schools from the community
- Workshop takes place within schools venues only
- Select workshop titles available on request







Key Achievements 2012-2013

- Overall growth in PD activities throughout the region with improved access to remote areas i.e. Russia, Romania, Ethiopia, Bahrain, Malawi, Nigeria and Ghana
- An increase in planned regional workshops in the Middle East and Turkey supporting the language of delivery in Arabic/Turkish by trained
 Arabic/Turkish speaking IB Educators
- Implementation of the **pilot Cluster Model** in AEM led by Cluster Host Schools in Russia, Kazakhstan, Turkey, UAE, Germany and Switzerland
- Improvements in the In-school model guidelines, terms & conditions and processes resulting in improved growth and efficiency of the model
- Development of specialized workshop topics; Field Studies, Turkish in the 20th century and category 3 focus on Internal Assessment and Extended Essay
- Development of the pilot Blended model, both 1 and 2 day models






Overall Quality Rating PD

Overall Quality PD








Quality rating by Event Model

(January-June 2013)










Quality rating by Programme

(January – June 2013)










Quality ratings by Category

Planned Goals for 2013-2014


- **Continued growth** in PD activities throughout the region with improved access to remote areas i.e. Russia, Kazakhstan, Turkey, Middle East, Armenia, Zimbabwe and Mauritius
- New subjects guide revisions planned for regional workshops for 8 DP subjects and all MYP next chapter subjects for 2013-2014
- An increase in planned regional workshops in the Middle East, Turkey, Spain and Russia supporting the language of delivery in Arabic, Turkish and Russian by trained Arabic, Turkish, Spanish and Russian speaking IB Educators
- Implementation of the **pilot Blended Model** in AEM focusing on 1 day model
- Cluster model implementation as an official IBAEM PD model of delivery focusing on further supporting remote areas; Africa, Russia, Eastern Europe
- Development of specialized workshops in Leadership as well as the Leadership Programme and Educator Certificate
- Continued growth with online workshops across the region








Projected Workshop Growth Moving into 2014

New PD Developments and Opportunities Cluster Pilot Model

What is it? A new fully certified, quality assured PD delivery model providing innovative support to IB schools and community needs not met by the current PD offering.

How could this support our school and community?

- Access challenges
- Non- availability of the workshop topics
- Geographical limitations
- Language Issues
- Large volume of teachers to be trained by schools

How does it work?

- A host school to lead on Cluster event collaboration with IB and neighbouring schools
- 2 schools minimum are required to create a Cluster event
- Workshop topic should not conflict with current PD offering within the region
- A minimum of 15 participants is required to run a Cluster workshop

New PD Developments and Opportunities Blended Pilot Model

What is it? A new fully certified, quality assured PD delivery model providing innovative support to IB schools through flexible, accessible and interactive PD

How could this support our school and community?

- Flexibility and time limitations
- Affordability challenges
- Geographical limitations
- Networking and reflection time are required elements of the training results

How does it work?

- Register as per normal via IBIS and/or via the IB website
- 2-6 hours of online interactive training via Moodle software prior to the face-to-face component
- 6-12 hours (1-2 days) face-to-face training connected to a regional workshop learning environment
- 2 -4 hours of online interactive training via Moodle software post face-to-face component to close event

IB Educator certificate

- The IB offers two distinct certification experiences in teaching and learning:
 - The IB certificate in teaching and learning offers students the opportunity to examine the principles and practices associated with one of the IB programmes. The courses that lead to this certificate shape pre-service, new and experienced educators into reflective practitioners and teacher researchers.
 IB practices.
 - The IB advanced certificate in teaching and learning research offers students the opportunity to supplement their existing IB experience with rigorous, systematic investigative work to further their knowledge and experience. Participants delve deeper into curriculum development, pedagogy and assessment through exploring relevant literature and their own IB practices.




